#### Performances

All YPAS performances listed in this brochure are presented at Rent Auditorium in Whitfield Hall, 1100 College Street, Columbus, MS, on the campus of Mississippi University for Women. (To the right of the main campus gate.) Shows begin at 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. and generally run 50-60 minutes. Doors will open at 9 a.m. and 12 noon for student seating. Remember, you will need to allow plenty of time for bus/vehicle unloading, parking, etc. After buses have unloaded, they will be directed to a designated parking area.

#### Price

YPAS fees are \$4 per show, per student/extra chaperone.
